

English 10- Composition & New Media

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Introduction

Welcome to English 10- Composition & New Media! English 10 is now comprised of five different 2-credit options. Island ConnectEd is offering them in pairs as students are required to complete 4 credits total. Composition and New Media is one of the available options. Composition 10 has the focus of utilizing critical thinking and exploration to develop skills around written communication. New Media 10 reflects the ever-increasing and always changing role of technology in our society.

This course is designed to have students explore a range of texts, both traditional and digital, to deepen their understanding of diverse, complex ideas about identity, others, and the world. We all understand text differently depending on individual worldviews and perspectives as they are socially, culturally, geographically, and historically constructed. Language shapes our ideas and influences others. With this in mind, the course works to have students question what they hear, read, and view to contribute to their ability to be educated and engaged citizens.

Active Status Assignment

All courses with Island ConnectEd require you to complete an Active Status Assignment that demonstrates you have worked with at least 5% of the learning outcomes for the course. The English 10 Active Status Assignment has two sections. They are reading/viewing and writing assignments that will have students:

- Think critically, creatively, and reflectively to explore ideas within, between, and beyond texts--*Composition*
- Demonstrate speaking and listening skills (ie. paraphrasing building on others' ideas) in a variety of formal and informal contexts for a range of purposes (ie. to explore, to explain, to take a position)--*Composition*
- Use writing and design processes (ie. determining purpose, generating ideas, drafting, revising and editing) to plan, develop, and create engaging and meaningful texts for a variety of purposes and audiences--*Composition*

- Use the conventions of Canadian spelling, grammar, and punctuation proficiently and as appropriate to the context--*Composition*
- Apply appropriate strategies to comprehend written, oral, visual, and multimodal texts (ie. oral language strategies such as expression, listening for specifics, summarizing and paraphrasing)--New Media
- Recognize and appreciate how different forms (ie. poetry), formats, structures and features of texts enhance and shape meaning and impact --New Media
- Construct meaningful personal connections between self, text, and world by using reading strategies--*New Media*
- Respond to text in personal, creative, and critical ways--*New Media*

Assessment

Your grade in this course is determined by the quality of work that you submit. Your grade is composed of Assignments, Quizzes, Unit Projects/Presentations and Self-Reflections. Grades are calculated according to the following weightings:

Reading Comprehension 30% Writing Skills 30% Create and Communicate 30% Reflections 10%

Mastery is encouraged. Students who wish to improve their work and resubmit are invited to discuss their options with their teacher. When the authenticity of student work is in question, the teacher reserves the right to base final grades on teacher supervised assignments and assessments.
