We want to ensure students are not surprised by this firm deadline for Grade 11 and 12 course completions. It does mean that any grade 11 or 12 courses that are not completed by marks cut-off in June will be given a final grade of "Withdrawn".

Students requiring their courses for graduation should make certain that their courses are completed on time. Any students still requiring the course, may enroll in the new version of the course the following year.
