

Instrumental Music 10 (Concert Band, Orchestra, Jazz Band, or Guitar)

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Introduction

Welcome to Instrumental Music 10. This course is reserved for students who are taking all, or most of their courses through Island ConnectEd (or with permission from the instructor). The course is designed for students who are working with a community music teacher. Students will engage in reflective practice about growth in skills.

What to Expect

The course is divided into three sections, however several components of unit 2 and 3 can be done concurrently.

Unit 1: Introductory Activities

- Selecting your instrument and community instructor
- Consent to share information (allowing instructor to communicate with community music instructor)
- Goal Setting
- First week of instruction and practice with reflective self-evaluation
- Ethics in Music and Performance
- Second week of instruction and practice with reflective self-evaluation
- Unit 2: Performance and Practice
 - Performance examples submitted
 - Beginning of course
 - Middle of course
 - End of course
 - Weekly practice journals
 - Minimum of 12 weeks of journals that reflect on the relationship between practice and goal achievement.
 - Minimum of 100 hours of combined instruction and practice sessions
 - NOTE: Both the minimum number of weeks and the minimum number of hours must be met in order to complete the course

Unit 3: Theory (Language) and Technique

- Music as storytelling
- Music notation (standard)
- Music Theory Submissions (beginning, middle and end of course)
- Technique project

Assessment

Grades will be calculated according to the following weightings.
