Student are reminded that they cannot visit (trespass on) other school sites during school hours; rather they are encouraged to work on their courses at home.

Scent Free Site



Please be aware that we have several staff and students that have scent sensitivities. The term "Scent Free" can be a bit tricky as most people think of

perfumes, after-shaves etc. as items with scents. However, when we talk about scents, we "usually mean the smells or odours from ingredients in all cosmetics (perfume, make-up, shampoo, deodorant, etc.) and from other products such as lotions, air fresheners, cleaners etc.

Please assist us in further helping to make our site scent free by (a) learning about the concern, (b) helping to ensure that you or your family is scent-free when visiting our site, and (c) being an advocate by gently letting people know if you smell scents on them while they are onsite.

Citrus Free & Nut Aware

In addition to being Scent Free, our school is also Citrus Free and Nut Aware/Sensitive. There is a reason we sometimes call



ourselves the "sensitive" school.

We have a staff member and potential some students who are allergic to Citrus fruits and chemicals, and some students who are allergic to peanuts and tree nuts.

To help keep our learning environment safe for all students, staff and parents please avoid bringing citrus fruits and beverages, and foods that contain nuts to school.

Remember indirect contact can have harmful impacts. A student who ate a peanutbutter sandwich and uses a chromebook may subsequently impact a nut-sensitive student who later uses that same chromebook.
