2) Tuesday, October 31st, Costume Parade



This year October 31st falls on our in-person learning day, and we know that some students and families enjoy wearing costumes on this day. Our K-12 students will have the option to wear costumes in class on this day

Patrick and I will be hosting a costume parade on Tuesday, October 31st for all of our K-12 students.

- Students who are attending am classes are to line-up outside (or inside their classroom based on teacher discretion) at 11:20am
- Students who are attending pm classes can also line up at their classes for 11:30am.
- Grade 8/9 students can meet in their room.
- Grade 10-12 students can meet in the secondary rooms.
- We will start the parade in room 101 and collect students as we parade down the hallways, towards the gym.
- Once in the gym, we will parade around the gym with music, take pictures and distribute treats.
- Anyone who is late can make their way to the gym.
- We are hoping to be finished around 11:40ish and the gym will be supervised by Patrick and I until the start of the next class.

As this is still an in-person learning day and Island ConnectEd is a K-12 setting we ask that families choosing to wear costumes adhere to the guidelines below.

- Students must be identifiable and visible to ensure safety.
- Masks are not permitted. Face makeup is permitted provided the student is still identifiable.
- Costumes that depict violence, alcohol or drugs are not appropriate.
- Fake weapons are not permitted.
- Costumes that are provocative, sexual in nature or employ questionable props are not permitted.
- Costumes should not hinder a student's ability to participate in regular class activities, travel through the school and outdoor spaces safely.
