## 1) Thursday, October 31st, Costume Parade



This year October 31st falls on our clubs day, and we know that some students and families enjoy wearing costumes on this day. Our K-12

students will have the option to wear costumes to clubs on this day if it doesn't interfere with their activity.

Patrick and I will be hosting a costume parade on Thursday, October 31st for all of our K-12 students.

- Following clubs students are to gather outside on the blacktop or under the covered spaces (if it's raining) at 11:35-11:40 am
- We will start the parade from the elementary covered space and parade down the hallways, towards the gym.
- Once in the gym, we will parade around the gym with music, take pictures and distribute treats.
- Anyone who is late can make their way to the gym.
- We are hoping to be finished around noonish and the gym will be supervised by Patrick and I until 12:15pm.

As this is still an in-person learning day and Island ConnectEd is a K-12 setting we ask that families choosing to wear costumes adhere to the guidelines below.

- Students must be identifiable and visible to ensure safety.
- Masks are not permitted during instructional time. Face makeup is permitted provided the student is still identifiable.
- Costumes that depict violence, alcohol or drugs are not appropriate.
- Fake weapons are not permitted.
- Costumes that are provocative, sexual in nature or employ questionable props are not permitted.
- Costumes should not hinder a student's ability to participate in regular class activities, travel through the school and outdoor spaces safely.

#### 4) PAC K-7 Science Activity "Code and Go Mice" Wednesday, Oct 30th Rm 116

Welcome to the science of computational thinking! In this workshop, students learn how to code using a Code and Go Robot Mouse which can be programmed with travel directions to navigate through mazes. By the end of the workshop, students will understand how to code specific commands, and how they are combined to form a program. They will problem solve by developing the ability to decompose a problem into sub-problems and how to write specific sets of instructions – similar to how a computer scientist writes code to instruct a computer to perform a desired action.
